

Betty Auchard, a native of Iowa, retired art teacher, mother of four and grandmother of fourteen, started writing in 1998 after the death of her husband.

Her new memoir, "The Home for the Friendless: Finding Hope, Love, and Family," was a finalist in the National Indie Excellence Awards in two categories: one for content and another for book design.

"The Home for the Friendless" takes place in Iowa, and is a collection of Betty's humorous and poignant stories about her unconventional family making their way through the Depression and WWII. Julia Matsushima has written a book *For the Love of Aimee: A Memoir.*Owner of an interior design and consulting business and a community leader, Julie Riera Matsushima's life took a dramatic turn with the birth of twin granddaughters in 1997. Since accompanying her three-year-old handicapped granddaughter to Poland for cutting-edge cerebral palsy therapy, Julie has tirelessly advocated for children with special needs.

In 2001 she established the nonprofit That's Amore Charitable Foundation, Inc. to serve children with disabilities.

Helen H. Wang is a Forbes columnist, consultant, and expert on China's middle class.

Wang's book *The Chinese Dream:* The Rise of the World's Largest Middle Class and What It Means to You is top rated #3 on Amazon Kindle Store. Wang has been quoted by the Wall Street Journal, The Christian Science Monitor, and featured in San Jose Mercury News, Boston Review, China Daily, Asia Times, and other major media.

Originally from China, Wang has lived in the U. S. for over twenty years.

## **Help Protect All Students from Bullying and Harassment!**

Tell the Senate to Promote the Safe Schools Improvement Act (S. 506)

This week, AAUW released a brand new report about sexual harassment in grades seven through twelve, Crossing the Line: Sexual Harassment at School. The many disturbing stories and statistics our researchers gathered add up to one fact: sexual harassment is part of everyday life in middle schools and high schools across America.

You can do your part, right now, to help change this: Ask your senators to

promote the Safe Schools Improvement Act (S. 509)!

The Safe Schools Improvement Act would significantly strengthen schools' ability and responsibility to combat sexual harassment and bullying. It would require schools to have comprehensive anti-harassment and bullying policies and promote prevention strategies. The bill would also tell schools to maintain and report data regarding incidents of bullying and harassment.

The best and fastest way for this critical bill to become law is as an

amendment to the reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). ESEA is the law that sets some of the educational and disciplinary standards by which middle and high schools which receive federal funding — and right now, its anti-harassment and bullying rules are woefully inadequate.

So if you, your friends, or children were bullied or harassed, you can stand up and say "Enough is enough." Tell your senators to support the Safe Schools Improvement Act (S.506) as an amendment to the Elementary and Secondary Education Act reauthorization!

#### **GTC TOUR**

Although most of us on the committee are very familiar with the Georgia Travis Center we have been made aware of a number of changes in the building which we wanted to see. Thanks to Julia Burkhead, Executive Director, we enjoyed a lengthy tour of the Center along with a quick run through of the Commercial Street Inn across from GTC. The huge warehouse building is a welcoming environment for the many people in need. The front reception area is freshly painted, and after checking in with the receptionist a client is taken to the front office where the social worker accesses the needs and begins the referral process. The client can then do any of the following. The large center room has a cafe for a hot lunch and the station where one picks up their towel and toiletries for the shower room. Laundry facilities are off to the side. Meanwhile - from this station, one can see the women in the computer room with the teacher, the hall to the children's day care center, the circle of women in the domestic violence workshop, and the door to the room where substance abuse addition therapy is taking place. Along the hall is the fully equipped medical examination room where a doctor volunteers twice a week. Outside, a complete playground awaits the children.

So rather than a barren warehouse, it is colorful, bustling with activity, and serving people with a variety of needs. Next month we will describe Commercial Street Inn as we report on the holiday party. Good wishes for your holiday season.

## Two Longtime branch AAUW Members have Died

## Lillian Nerenberg

Lillian Nerenberg, teacher, author, and attorney, died on November 2 in Los Gatos. She was an Honorary Lifetime Member of the American Association of University Women, a Charter Member and a 50-year Member of the Southwest Santa Clara Valley League of Women Voters. Coauthor of high school text American Government in Action.

Lillian started law school at age 54, completing the University of Santa Clara program in four years while continuing her 25-year career teaching Political Science at West Valley College. As a Charter Member of the California State Bar, she spent her entire legal career doing pro bono work for Senior Adult Legal Assistance.



## **Maxine Deurell**

Maxine Pexton Deurell, a longtime resident of Saratoga, died on Aug. 9. She was 95.

She was born in Neligh, Neb., and later lived on ranch near Douglas, Wyo., before moving to Santa Rosa. She attended Santa Rosa Junior College and graduated from San Jose State, where she met her husband of 54 years, Herman Deurell. Her first teaching position was in a one-room schoolhouse near Santa Rosa.

After the couple married, they settled in Saratoga. Mrs. Deurell served on the Youth Center committee and as a Girl Scout leader (for which she received the Thanks Badge that recognized outstanding performance as an adult volunteer), and she was a past president of the Los Gatos-Saratoga branch of the AAUW (1973-1974) and the Saratoga Foothill Club (1979-1980).
