Erica Goss is the Poet Laureate of Los Gatos, California. She was born in Germany and raised in California. She has been writing poetry since she was a child. She is the author of *Wild Place* (2012, Finishing Line Press) and *Vibrant Words: Ideas and Inspirations for Poets* (2014, Pushpen Press).

As Poet Laureate for Los Gatos, she organized the first St. Patrick's Day Poetry Walk, created Poems-in-the-Window (local businesses displayed poems during National Poetry Month), recorded The Poetry Podcast (50-plus recordings of poems in a variety of languages), established the first Los Gatos Poet Laureate Scholarship, and launched The Poetry Kitchen, a poetry reading series at the Los Gatos Library.

Erica's work is featured in numerous anthologies and journals, and she received the Many Mountains Moving Prize for poetry in 2011. Erica is the host of *Word to Word*, a Show About Poetry, on KCAT Cable TV in Los Gatos, and writes *The Third Form*, a column about video poetry, for Connotation Press. She leads poetry workshops and classes in the San Francisco Bay Area.

About the Authors . . .



BARBARA JOANS

Barbara Joans is an Anthropologist and former Director of the Merritt Museum of Anthropology as well as Department Chair. She has lived among the Iroquois, Bannock-Shoshoni and Bikers. She also works frequently as a legal anthropologist appearing in court cases as an expert witness. She wanted her own name. JOANS is her middle name and an added S.

Barbara received a BA from Brooklyn College, then married and had two kids, both boys, and both "wonderful." She received her MA from New York University and in 1974 received her Ph.D. in Anthropology from CUNY. She was part of the civil rights movement, traveling between New York and Washington and then part of the anti-war movement. Her work has been published in journals and edited anthropology text books and newspapers.

Her first book is *BIKE LUST: Harleys, Women and American Society* (2001, University of Wisconsin Press). After twelve years, it's still in print and is featured in the Beat Museum in San Francisco. Her next book is *THE CHANGING WOMAN: Women of a Certain Age* (2013, Amazon Press). A partial memoir, a partial analysis of the different cultures women grew up within and a partial glimpses of the future.

She writes for *Thunder Press*, a motorcycle newspaper, and is the only Moto-Anthropologist in the country. She has four grandchildren and at the age of fifty-nine had the pleasure of watching her grandchildren passenger on a big bike with her husband. She lives with her second husband, two cats, and three motorcycles in San Francisco and Santa Cruz.



LAURI PASTRONE

For **Lauri Pastrone**, this book really began in 2000 when she moved from Northern California to London with her husband and 6-month-old daughter. Lauri and baby Giovanna tagged along on business trips with her husband and found themselves in Amsterdam where she happened to see the Oprah Winfrey show – the only Englishlanguage program she could find. Oprah was interviewing Zainab Salbi, founder of *Women for Women International* (WFWI), a foundation that helps war victims create new lives by offering skills training and other assistance. Often the biggest victims in battle-torn countries are women, who aren't just driven from their homes but are attacked, raped and forgotten.

Eventually Lauri decided to become a sponsor. Her \$30 per month donation — "That's less than my latte budget," she says — covered a year-long sponsorship for one woman, but Lauri wanted to do more. So on her 50th birthday, she rallied a team of volunteers and launched a cookbook project to raise funds for the charity, with considerably more in mind than a quick-printed compendium of favorite casseroles. They wanted to publish a glorious volume involving celebrities, humanitarians and notable chefs.

Four intense years in the making, "Share" (Kyle Books) includes 100 unfussy, delicious recipes, and both hair-raising statistics about women in wartorn parts of the world and heart-rending profiles of some of the women helped by the charity.

National AAUW Tech Trek Survey Shows Solid Results

The results of the 2013 survey of Tech Trek attendees by our national AAUW organization are in and they are impressive. Of the girls surveyed:

- 91% report improved selfconfidence in science classes
- 78% report improved selfconfidence in math classes
- 77% completed precalculus (compared to a national average of 37%)
- 87% completed algebra (compared to 78% nationally)
- 82% selected more science classes in high school

Our branch has participated in this program, designed to stimulate interest and awareness in STEM (*Science, Technology, Engineering and Math*), since its creation in 1998. We have also helped to track our former campers via phone and email to enable the periodic surveys that provide us with data to determine the effectiveness of the program.

Now it is time to bring our portion of the master database up to date by contacting approximately 40 of our 56 camper alumnae (girls now in high school, college or the work-place) to collect current contact, career, and education information to update our records and be ready for the next survey. Many of these girls have left the area but may be available for email or phone contact. Other girls are still part of our community and may be part of your extended network, maybe even your neighbors.

If we recruit ten callers, each person will need to call only 4 girls. Of course, obtaining a current email address or phone

number may be a challenge, but I do have an Excel file with contact information to use as a starting point and it was last updated in 2007.

Learning about Early California Women

Dr. Rose Marie Beebe and Dr. Robert M. Senkewicz presented a fascinating picture of several early California women at our general meeting November 10. One was Apolinaria Lorenzana, a little 7-year old orphan girl who was transported by ship from Mexico City to Alta California in 1801 with several other children. She taught herself how to write, became a nurse, and lived until 1884. Another was an indigenous woman named Isidora Filomena, the wife of Chief Solano, whose testimony is one of the few documents about Native Americans before the arrival of the "white men." Another woman talked about the Bear Flag Rebellion of 1846, and one essentially eloped with an American when official permission to marry was denied by the Spanish officials.

These were strong women whose first-hand "testimonies" were recorded under the direction of Hubert Howe Bancroft in the 1870's. You can read more about them in Dr. Beebe and Dr. Senkewicz' book **Testimonios** which will be reissued in the spring.



2014 News Bytes & Up-coming 2015 Training Day

Supreme Court: Birth Control is, in Fact, Your Boss's Business

In a troubling 5-4 decision, the U.S. Supreme Court in July sided with two for-profit companies that challenged a provision of the Affordable Care Act requiring employer health insurance plans to cover preventive services like contraception at no extra cost to employees.

Plaintiffs Hobby Lobby, an arts and crafts store, and Conestoga Wood, a cabinetry business, said their employees shouldn't receive coverage for intrauterine devised and the morning after pill under the companies' health insurance because the owners have religious objections to the contraceptives.

The opinion said that "closely held" companies — which account for 90 percent of all U.S. corporations don't have to cover birth control. Although the court claimed that its decision was narrow and only applied to these specific circumstances. AAUW Vice President of Government Relations Lisa Maatz says that the decision could result in corporations challenging other medical procedures or medications, including other forms of birth control, and dangerously singled out women for discrimination.



Women's Testimony Scarce in Congress

A study released in September by the Sunlight Foundation found that women make up less than one-quarter of the witnesses called to testify before committees in the U.S. House of Representative. Much of the work Congress does to draft laws is completed in committees and subcommittees, where lawmakers hear from and interview experts and people with personal connections to the issues. The representation was worst in the committee on agriculture, where only 13 percent of witnesses were women, and best in the committee on education, where 40 percent of witnesses were women.



Universities Fined for Not Disclosing Assaults

The University of Nebraska, Kearney, was fined \$65,000 for not correctly reporting crimes that occurred on campus. With this move, the U.S. Department of Education has now fined four schools this year for violating the Clery Act, which requires schools to record crimes, including sexual assaults, and disclose the information publicly. The other schools that the department found to be violating the law were Mid-Atlantic Christian University, Midlands Technical College, and Sterling College.
