Protect Yourself, Social Security Lies Spread

Economic Policy Institute Publishes List of "Top Ten Lies about Social Security"

With some GOP presidential candidates and others targeting Social Security, the Economic Policy Institute found it prudent to publish an article *debunking* some of the ten most common myths or misunderstandings about Social Security. The fact sheet addresses confusion over the size of benefits, the strength of the trust fund, and the costs of the Social Security program.

AAUW believes that it is vital to women's economic security to provide for the long-term solvency of Social Security and to maintain its current guaranteed benefits. The current Social Security system is more than just a retirement program; across the life-span, it is one of the most successful anti-poverty programs in our nation's history, providing benefits to many children, disabled workers, surviving spouses, and retirees. Older women especially benefit greatly from this program, since many depend on Social Security as their primary source of retirement

Thousands Receive Gifts! Gifts for Teens a Huge Success!

Gifts for Teens had another banner year distributing 1546 bags and special gifts. Gift bags, sweatshirts and blankets were given to local impoverished teens. These needy teens served by Sacred Heart Community Service and the homeless, group home and foster care teens served by 3 other agencies, appreciated the festive bags full of fun and useful items this holiday season. Over 425 industrious volunteers prepared gift items and assembled the bags over a two week period in December. Judging from the chatter, laughter and efficient industry of this enthusiastic volunteer army, the workers had a good time while helping the poor of our community. AAUW groups, school teens, alumnae moms, Cisco and corporate teams, local groups, many individuals (and one baby!), participated in the gift bag and tote assembly. 1346 bags stuffed full with tshirts, cosmetics, handmade scarves, flip flops, jewelry, socks, Target and food gift cards, hygiene items, snacks and other fun small gifts were distributed to local teenagers. Additionally, 200 sweatshirts and blankets were given out.

A story to share... One young Mom, desperately seeking a gift for her teenage son, dropped by the assembly site to ask for help on December 14. She attends college, holds



down a part time job yet didn't have enough income for holiday gifts and asked if she could work in exchange for a gift duffel bag. She gratefully chose a large, full duffel and insisted on helping in the assembly line that afternoon.
