

#### **America's Cup Comes to San Francisco!**


Saturday, February 9, 2013

### Hear About the Traditions of the America's Cup



The America's Cup is the most coveted trophy in sports; its competition is steeped in tradition going back over 160 years. From its first winning yacht, *America*, which was built as a vehicle for winning money on the water, to the latest challengers and defenders, whose teams spend up to \$100 million for each campaign, the competition has always attracted widespread international attention and fierce competition.

The tradition for the Cup was originally envisioned as a way to promote "friendly competition among nations," but it has resulted in international scandal, lawsuits, and charges of cheating, deception, and spying. There was even a threat to withdraw ambassadorships.

Competition for the Cup has drawn millionaires and billionaires.

yachtsmen, boat designers, space-age engineers and scientists. It has resulted in innovations and breakthroughs in yacht design and has employed advancements in computer technology, hydraulics, weather forecasting, and mechanical and aeronautical engineering.

Our speaker, Lawrence Tartaglino, received his Bachelor's and MBA degrees from San Jose State Univer-

sity. He worked in management for a multinational pharmaceutical company, owned his own business, and taught accounting and finance classes at a California community college. He has been an avid sailor most of his life. Since retiring, he has enjoyed developing talks and speaking on subjects including business and maritime history and travel.



### Report from the Committee on Homeless Women and Children

The Committee on Homeless Women and Children had a very successful dinner and gift exchange on December 14th at the Commercial Street Inn (CSI). Sixteen women and their children enjoyed a dinner of chicken tetrazzini, vegetarian lasagna, mac and cheese for the children, plus a tossed green salad, steamed green beans, rolls, butter and chocolate cake for dessert. Meals were saved for the seven women who were working. The CSI dining room was very crowded, so we walked across the street to the Georgia Travis Center to open gifts. A baby sitter watched the children in the shelter. Because of the generosity of many friends of the Committee we had 113 gifts. Presents were set aside for those women at work and for some long term drop-in clients at Georgia Travis Center.

By opening the gifts at Georgia Travis we had the time to socialize with the women and hear their stories. There was a pregnant woman with two children who was past due her due date. A grandmother in the shelter with her grandchildren opened only one of her gifts because she wanted to open the other gifts with her grandchildren. A woman shared with me that her 24-year old son had a successful kidney transplant, but her 27-year old son had been murdered in 2007. Another woman told us it was her first Christmas in 17 years, having left home when she was 14. They also enjoyed the See's candy purchased from the late Irmalyn Benkert's memorial fund.

Of course, the women were so thankful for the lovely gifts they received. The committee received lots of hugs and kisses at the end of the evening. The spirit of Season was there with all of us - LOVE.

Spring Hats so look through your closets and select your best chapeau for the occasion.



#### 1410 - A Number to Celebrate!

GIFTS FOR TEENS is celebrating phenomenal success this year! During the rainy December Holidays, durable bags containing nicer contents and packed fuller than any time in the past 14 years, were given to low-income and homeless local teens. 1,410 of them!

THE NUMBERS ARE IN! Gifts for

Teens distributed 1410 bags and special gifts to the impoverished youth of our valley. In December, it took a full 2 weeks to prepare items and fill the totes and duffels. A high quality hooded sweatshirt for each and every teen, cosmetic bags filled with Neutrogena teen skin-care products (7 pallets arriving on the final packing day....whew!), 2 colorful, stylish t-shirts per teen and many other fun and useful gifts were the highlights of the bags this year. The San Jose Rotary Club bought all the bags and totes through a \$10,000 cash grant and The Farrington Historic Foundation grant provided the necessary seed money to launch the sweatshirt drive. 5 Agencies' teen clients received colorful girls' totes worth \$158 per bag (see photo) and guys duffel bags valued at \$145 each. The total value of the project is estimated at \$210,000, with \$57,000 cash raised and \$153,000 in items donated!

#### **EVERYONE HELPED OUT!**

Amazingly, an elderly woman in her nineties, having the use of only one hand, knit a beautiful gift scarf using a special tool. From a generous donor, the final dozen girl's sweatshirts came on the last day of the packing process.

Over 300 volunteers helped prepare and pack the full to overflowing bags. Lunch was provided to GFT workers on 3 separate days by anonymous donors. Corporate and community groups enthusiastically donated both

time and funds. Cash donations from individuals and AAUW members topped \$20,000. Students from Presentation and Mitty High Schools gathered \$6,000 worth of gift cards. And a handsome middle school boy shyly brought girl's scarves when he came to volunteer. On the final day, SJSU Fraternity members and GFT volunteers helped load and unload 2 large truckloads totaling 900 bags destined for teen clients of Sacred Heart Community Service.

A heartfelt "*Thanks*" to all! FOR THIS SUCCESS we are most grateful and yes, we are celebrating!
