

# States Urge Supreme Court to Uphold Affirmative Action

Fourteen states are urging the Supreme Court to uphold affirmative action in higher education admissions. The states are led by New York Attorney General Eric Schneiderman. The Supreme Court will hear arguments in the case, Fisher v. University of Texas at Austin, on October 10. The lawsuit is against the University of Texas, on behalf of a white student who was not admitted to the school in 2008. The University of Texas says that race is one of many factors for deciding admittance, and they do not use a quota system. In addition to the states' support, the Justice Department and other government agencies have signed a brief noting the importance of diversity in making college admissions decisions.

AAUW supports affirmative action programs that establish equal opportunity for women and minorities and improve gender, racial, and ethnic diversity in educational institutions and in workplaces. AAUW has also filed an amicus brief urging the Supreme Court to uphold the University of Texas' affirmative action program.

## Host a Presidential Debate Watch Party

#### AAUW Has All the Tools You'll Need!

Now that the political conventions are over, it's time to gear up for the presidential debates! Debate watch parties are a great way to engage family, friends, and your community to discuss the issues and the candidates' stances on policies that are important to women and their families.

AAUW is once again an official voter education partner of the Commission on Presidential Debates and its *DebateWatch* program, which urges citizens like you to watch the televised presidential and vice presidential debates and talk about what they've learned. *The DebateWatch* site includes a complete guide to hosting a *DebateWatch* party with details on what to do before, during, and after the debate as well as general discussion questions to use. AAUW has also created fact sheets on key issues for you to distribute at your *DebateWatch* party and use as a discussion piece.

The dates of the three presidential debates are:

- 1. Wednesday, October 3, moderated by Jim Lehrer, Executive Editor of the *PBS NewsHour*
- 2. Tuesday, October 16, moderated by Candy Crowley, Chief Political Correspondent, *CNN*, and Anchor, CNN's *State of the Union*
- 3. Monday, October 22 Bob Schieffer, Chief Washington Correspondent, CBS News, and Moderator, *Face the Nation*

The vice presidential debate is Thursday, October 11, and it will be moderated by Martha Raddatz, Senior Foreign Affairs Correspondent, ABC News (*NOTE: This is the only vice presidential debate*).

All of the debates will begin at 9 pm ET and end at 10:30 pm ET.)

## Teleconference – Between AAUW and the White House

## **Public Policy Watch** – Highlights of Issues Affecting Women and Girls

AAUW Public Policy chairs all over the nation had the chance to connect with White House spokespersons regarding these issues in a conference call recently. Here are the highlights:

- GET OUT THE VOTE We are all urged to remind family and friends to be sure to VOTE this November. Don't just assume everyone will vote, *Remind Them!*
- STEM EDUCATION Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics careers are still not fully populated by women. The White House has a copy of *"Why So Few?"*, the AAUW research on women in these fields. Women have half the jobs in the economy, but only 25% of the STEM positions. We all need to encourage students to *"hang in there"* even though it may not be easy. There are more job openings in these fields than there are qualified Americans to fill them.
- MASTER TEACHER CORPS The administration's initiative to identify and elevate the best STEM teachers to help other teachers. Those selected will be given a salary raise of \$20,000. Question: *How to identify the best teachers?*
- VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ACT Passed by Senate, now a stalemate in House. This bill (S. 1925, H.R. 4970) focuses on girls ages 16-24. The greatest number of abused women are in this age range. We are encouraged to write to our representatives in support of this bill.
- **HEALTHCARE ACT** Lots of information at www.Healthcare.gov

#### **BERNADINE AMES FAWLEY** *October 7 1925 - July 9, 2012*

Bernie was born and raised in Minnesota. She attended the University of Minnesota for 3 years, studying Journalism. Bernie left to take a job as a photographer and journalist for the *Minneapolis Star-Journal*. She moved on to become editor for the *Dayton News*, a bimonthly magazine for the employees of Dayton's Department Store. Being independent, she drove across country to California where she finished her degree in Home Economics at San Francisco State University. She soon met and married Ivan Fawley.

After spending time in Japan, where Ivan served in the U.S. Air Force, they returned to the Bay Area and reared their family. Eventually Bernie returned to school and earned a double Masters in Home Economics and in Education/Counseling from San Jose State University. Bernie taught Nutrition part-time at West Valley College. She was an accomplished violinist for the San Jose Orchestra and played tennis into her early 80s.

Bernie was a long-time member of the Saratoga Foothill Club and the Los Gatos-Saratoga AAUW where she was active on the Homeless Committee.
