Meet Mara Otlans ~ Secretary



When the Soviets came into power in the Baltics during WWII, my parents and older brother joined the masses who fled their homeland of Latvia and somehow arrived in Germany and the safety of the American Zone. It was there, in a displaced persons camp in Esslingen, that I was born. At that time, much of US immigration was handled through sponsorships received from churches and citizen groups willing to provide employment and accommodations for refugees. My mother worked for The Lutheran Federation which sorted many of the sponsorships, and she selected one that fit our family in a region that she thought might be similar in latitude

and climate to Latvia. That is how, at the age of 3, I arrived in Tacoma, Washington.

The early years were difficult, but my parents were enterprising, and we soon adapted to American life. My parents were also interested in preserving their culture, so in addition to regular school, we stayed close to the Latvian community and participated in language schools, summer camp, and dance groups. Interestingly, my children and grandchildren continue this connection to this day.

In 1968 I earned a BA degree in Psych from University of Oregon. Fairly quickly thereafter, I married and had two children. I was fortunate to spend their early years as a stay-at-home mom, but I also used this time to earn an MBA at Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma.

The majority of my career was in construction and home building, culminating as CFO for a midsize home builder. That was my position during the collapse of the industry in 2008, when my job became a full-time negotiation with banks and lawyers in an ultimately successful attempt to escape bankruptcy. No bankruptcy, but also no future for the industry in the near term, so we closed the doors, and I took that opportunity to retire. (continued next page)

By this time, my children were both residing in California, my son in Menlo Park and my daughter in Santa Cruz. Since both of my parents had passed, they convinced me to join them in 2017, and I now live in Campbell which is half way between them. It is a joy to be close to family, and the California weather and natural beauty is a bonus!

When looking for a community to enhance my new life, AAUW seemed a natural fit. I was familiar with the organization because my mother had belonged in Tacoma. Additionally, several retired friends pointed me toward it. It was great to find a group of intelligent and interesting women who enjoyed reading, hiking, and travel. And to get to know people, I quickly joined the Board as Sunshine Chair and became involved in Scholarship Recipient selection. I have since added Recording Secretary to my duties. I look forward to events and activities and continuing friendships in the coming season!

There were seven applicants for our scholarships for women transferring from West Valley College to a four-year college or university in science, technology, engineering or math (STEM). It is always difficult for the Local Scholarship Committee to select the winners because they all have outstanding academic records and laudable career goals. We are extremely pleased to introduce the four winners.

THALIA BILLAWALA hopes to attend UC Berkeley or Davis this fall to study cell biology. Her career goal is to become a **neonatologist**. She has long had an interest in medicine, and was able

to attend courses at West Valley College while still in high school. She was able to shadow an OB/GYN in the doctor's office. Later, during her recent years at West Valley College, she was one of the WVC students who started a Pre-Health Sciences Club to help members network and prepare themselves in the pursuit of health-care related majors. She was also a member of the Alpha Gamma Sigma Honor Society, a community service club.

TAHANI FAISAL plans to attend San Jose State University this fall to study Communicative Disorders and Sciences with the goal of becoming a **Speech Pathologist**. From her volunteer work at the Child Development Center at West Valley College, Tahani developed a passion for helping children. Her own learning difficulties caused her to take a class to learn how to better assist others, and then to work as a tutor at West Valley College.

TZELZIN HERNANDEZ hopes to attend UC Berkeley this fall to study cell and developmental biology. Her career goal is to get a **medical degree** and practice as an OB/GYN. She also plans to minor in music. Tzelzin has done a lot of volunteer work in her community and some of that included her work associated with the Mission College Symphony. She was one of the WVC students who formed the Pre-Health Sciences Club at West Valley College to help and encourage one another in their future studies, and was a STEM Peer Tutor assisting fellow students. Due to a difficult family life, which has caused her to take on many responsibilities, which would challenge any full-time student, the financial assistance from this scholarship will be very helpful.

MIA MUNEMITSU hopes to attend UCLA this fall to study mathematics or economics with a career goal in **computer science or data analysis**. Her love of mathematics began in high school and has grown while at WVC, where she gets new challenges. She was active in sports in high school and a member of an honor society. While at WVC she has worked as a peer tutor and also as an assistant coach for the high school badminton team; both have taught her better communication skills and patience.
