After moving to California, she continued subbing in the Cupertino School District and, being an active member of AAUW, especially enjoying the evening book group and various bridge groups.



More about the Authors and Their Books

Saul Lelchuk grew up in the Upper Valley, Vermont. He holds a B.A. in English from Amherst College and an M.A. from Dartmouth MALS; he teaches graduate creative writing at Dartmouth. He has taught and edited both fiction and nonfiction writing and served as a mentor for the PEN American Center Prison Writing Program.

Yangsze Choo is a fourth-generation Malaysian of Chinese descent. Choo grew up in Malaysia but, accompanying her diplomat father, spent her childhood in various countries. As a result, she says that she can eavesdrop (badly) in several languages. After graduating from Harvard University, Choo worked as a management consultant and at a startup before writing her first novel. *The Ghost Bride* (August 2013), set in colonial Malaya and the elaborate Chinese world of the afterlife, it was a NY Times bestseller and is a soon-to-be-aired Netflix original series!

A Quick Review of Night Tiger: A young houseboy and a dressmaker's apprentice get drawn into a mystery in 1930s Malaya.

Choo continues her exploration of Malayan folklore here with questions that point to the borders where the magical and the real overlap: Is someone murdering citizens of the Kinta Valley, or is it a tiger, a beast who wears human skin? Can spirits communicate with the living? Should superstitions—lucky numbers, rituals—govern a life? A sumptuous garden maze of a novel that immerses readers in a complex, vanished world.

Governor Signs AAUW-Supported Bills into Law

Several bills will become law due to the advocacy and research support offered by AAUW-CA; the major topics include:

- AB 9 -- Harassment and discrimination claims under California's Fair Employment and Housing Act (FEHA)
- AB 51 -- Labor code violation as a condition of employment.
- AB 59 -- Increasing youth voter turnout.
- AB 170 -- Liability for sexual harassment claims.
- AB 218 -- Gives sexual assault survivors sufficient time to access civil remedies.
- AB 381 -- Dating violence information
- AB 543 -- Ensures that all 9th through 12th grade students receive a written policy on sexual harassment information during orientation. AAUW's report "*Schools Are Still Underreporting Sexual Harassment and Assault*" was critical in helping support the legislative analyses for AB 543.
- AB 749 -- Future employment and sexual harassment or other claims.
- AB 809 -- Ensures that pregnant and student parents are aware of their Title IX rights.
- AB 922 -- Allows a woman providing human oocytes for research to be compensated for her time, discomfort, and inconvenience in the same manner as other research subjects.
- SB 24 -- Access to reproductive health services at public universities and colleges
- SB 142 -- Requires employers to have a written lactation policy and lactation spaces
