





The History of Women's Suffrage

After a hard-fought series of votes in the U.S. Congress and in state legislatures, the **Mineteenth Amendment** became part of the U.S. Constitution on August 18, 1920. It states, "The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex." To mark this year's centennial of Women's Suffrage, Bonnie J. Morris, PhD, will offer a lively history of the arguments FOR and AGAINST women's suffrage, taking us back to 19th century attitudes toward women in politics and public life.

Dr. Morris is currently a lecturer at UC Berkeley, and the author of sixteen books, including *Women's History for Beginners* which was broadcast on C-Span. Her book *The Feminist Revolution* was selected by Oprah magazine as top reading for Women's History Month. She has taught women's history for over 25 years at various universities and has been a guest lecturer for the Library of Congress and the State Department.

Equal Pay Day ~ Tuesday, March 31, 2020

Equal Pay Day symbolizes how far into the year women must work to earn what men earned in the previous year. In 2018, women received just 82 cents for every dollar paid to a man. Women of color often face a wider gap when compared to white men. Black women make 62 cents on the dollar, and Latinas make 54 cents on the dollar.

AAUW has facilitated *Start Smart* and *Work Smart Workshops* to help close the gap and now offers an online one-hour Work Smart Workshop for salary negotiation skills, accessed from the AAUW.org website.
