Message from Your Co-President

Now that 2020 is in the past, we should take a moment to reflect on what happened. We have a world pandemic which created sufferings, hardships and deaths for millions of people in the world. Here in the US, people lost their lives and jobs by the thousands, and long-time businesses experienced bankruptcy. We saw demonstrations and marches in support of Black Lives Matter. We had to shelter in place for over 9 months, forcing us to be safe for ourselves and for others. We saw a presidential election that continues to divide us.

I am personally happy to see 2020 gone for it was a year in which my family had a member with cancer, I was hospitalized for one week with low sodium and had to relearn how to walk, my daughter had brain surgery and our precious little dog had cancer all over his body and is not expected to live much longer.

From an article in the *San Jose Mercury News* on November 12, 2020, we learned that Santa Clara County women are most likely in California to work in a low-wage job. Women in our county made only 71 cents for every dollar a man made. Although Santa Clara County has the highest median income in the state at just under \$116,200, it has made little headway toward narrowing the gender gap. We still have work to do in this area.

In November, 2020, there was a breakthrough move when a woman named Kim Ng became the general manager of the Miami Marlins. This was the most noteworthy day for baseball since Jackie Robinson broke the color barrier in 1947.

Out of despair rises hope for a better tomorrow with the vaccine for Covid 19. We heard stories of heroism of first responders, medical doctors and nurses, senior residence workers, grocery store workers, farmers, post office employees, teachers, etc. On the other hand, we also saw thousands of people refusing to wear masks or maintain social distancing.

We foresee a more compassionate administration in the White House come January 20, 2021. President-elect Joe Biden selected the first woman Secretary of Treasury and an all-women communications staff. He has been true to his word of getting diversity in his administration. Kamala Harris, senator from California, was elected as the first woman Vice President.

The new year seems brighter, and we are grateful for all the little things we may have taken for granted. Marlene Lamb and I wish all of you a Happy New Year and an end to the pandemic.

Report from the Committee on Homeless Women

As Chair of the Committee on Homeless Women and Children I want to bring you up to date on our activities. "Activities" is a laughable word in these days of Covid-19. We have had no in-person meetings, we haven't even had a Zoom meeting. As you all know we did not have our Dazzle and Dahlias fund raiser, so my neighbors benefited with bouquets of flowers!



I want to thank you in AAUW who have donated a total of \$5,403 to the Committee. Using those donations and our existing funds, we have decided to help by writing checks. Because we still may not be able to have the fund raiser next year, we decided to save part of our bank account for 2021.

The CHWC made donations totaling \$15,150 to the following groups:

- To Family Supportive Housing: 3 laptops and 7 Chrome Books for the children to do homework on and to participate in FSH's enrichment programs and some as-needed items.
- To LifeMoves, The Villa and Georgia Travis House: Funds for Back-to-School backpacks for all children in the groups and for other-needed items.
- > To St. Luke's Pantry in Los Gatos: Funds for homeless women and children in Los Gatos
- To Bill Wilson Center's Maternity Program for Homeless Pregnant Women 18 24 years old: Funds for care and programs and a set-aside of \$750 for \$50 Christmas Gift certificates for these women.
- To Casa de Clara, San Jose: Funds for their mobile shower program for the homeless and for needs of their homeless program for women and children.
- > To Lifted Spirits, now a part of Front Door Agency: Funds for Lunches.
- > To Second Harvest of Silicon Valley: Funds for Food.
- > To Martha's Kitchen, Willow Glen: Funds for their meals for the homeless

As you see, it is a diverse giving, and one more reason to be a proud member of AAUW.

AAUW National Dues Set to Increase


The national AAUW Board of Directors voted to increase individual Member dues for the next three years. The dues will rise by \$3 for 2021-22, by \$5 for 2022-23, and by \$5 for 2023-24, making the total national dues for those years \$62, \$67 and \$72 respectively. All but \$3 of your annual dues remains tax deductible. This increase will be reflected on your renewal notice.

The decision wasn't made lightly. The Board is grateful for our members and proud of the work we've done this year. Nonetheless, in order to preserve the viability of this organization we all love, this action was necessary for AAUW to continue our mission to achieve gender equity.

Proceeds from these stimulating talks will support our Local Scholarships, given to women students at West Valley College who are majoring in a STEM field and transferring to a four-year university or college to complete their degree. 
