### Results of AAUW Vote

Many thanks to everyone who voted in AAUW's 2021 National Election. It took a mere three days to reach the required quorum—a testament to our members' passion and engagement.

AAUW's public policy priorities were approved by 92% of voters. The board-recommended ballot initiative to remove the college-degree membership requirement did not receive the two-thirds, or 66.6%, vote required to enact a bylaws change. However, the board is heartened that a remarkable 63% of you voted in favor of making this change, indicating a momentum shift toward a more inclusive membership. This was a significantly higher number than we saw in previous votes, which hovered just below 50%, to make the change.

While we have many voices, I know we all share the same commitment to AAUW's mission of advancing gender equity for women and girls through research, education and advocacy, and our vision of achieving equity for all. More than ever, we must embrace our values and continue to strive towards diversity, equity and inclusion; it's a journey that will never end.



No matter how you voted in this election, you are a valued part of our community. In fact, you—our members—are our core community, and the final decisions about board leaders and bylaws will always be yours to make. Now it's time to move forward together. Thanks again for making your voice heard.

### Message from Your Co-President

When hundreds of Trump supporters broke into the US Capitol on January 6, 2021, many of us were stunned. It was hard to believe what was going on. Although many of the people who participated in the violent insurrection were not members of a hate group, they harbored the hateful ideology used by these hate groups. Prior to that unforgettable day, we saw images of people demonstrating for months on the death of George Floyd at the knee of a White police officer, and there were other similar stories.



Television news began showing pictures of Asian Americans

being bullied and attacked and called names as the Coronavirus pandemic continued. And the latest tragedy close to home: the VTA Yard shootings by a disgruntled employee who hated some of his co-workers and employer.

Hate crime killings in America along with antisemitic violence spiked 14% in 2019. There are 838 active hate groups in the United States. Just think about that number.

As an Asian American, I have had a number of hate incidents in my life, including being a prisoner of war in my own country. Racism is not new to Asian Americans. Our California history is filled with racist legislation. Asian immigrants could not become naturalized nor own land. For a very long time, Asian Americans did not speak up against injustices. Today it is different with many standing up and speaking out. Congress passed an anti-hate Asian law recently.

What can we do if anything to help stop hate? We can teach our young people lessons of acceptance and understanding that all of us are equal and should be respected. We can show them through our lifelong experiences of kindness and compassion. Talking is good but actions are better.

Throughout this long pandemic, we saw many acts of kindness and compassion from the health care doctors and nurses, teachers, senior care facilities workers, farmers, grocery store workers, neighbors helping each other, people standing in front of their homes singing and dancing, people helping seniors work through the complexities of computer and the Internet to get their vaccines, and so much more.

You can make a difference by sharing a few words of encouragement to those who need them, by giving a smile or sharing a laughter, by standing up for those who need the courage to go on, by going out of your comfort zone to help those in need. Thank you.

She later earned her MS from San Jose State University in Administration of Justice and worked as a parole officer for many years. She joined our branch of AAUW in 1988 and quickly became involved in many activities including the gourmet group, book club, bridge, hikes and walks, travel, and the Committee on Homeless Women and Children. She was branch



president twice, first in 1995 to 1997, then as one of four co-presidents in 2001-2002, and also served as branch treasurer.

Pat traveled extensively over much of the globe and made several presentations to the Travel group about her adventures. She was a fierce competitor at the bridge table, and enjoyed playing games with her family. She was a wonderful lady, generous, intelligent and caring.
