Title IX: What You Don't Know Can Hurt You

Save the date: <u>Saturday, March 19, 2022 via Zoom</u> Sponsored by Interbranch Council, open to all. Event details in the March-April Grapevine.

Title IX is a federal civil rights law that was passed as part (Title IX) of the Education Amendments of 1972. It prohibits sex-based discrimination in any school or other education program that receives funding from the federal government. While Title IX is best known for its impact on high school and collegiate athletics, the original statute made no explicit mention of sports. The Supreme Court issued decisions in the 1980s and 1990s making clear that sexual harassment and sexual assault are forms of sex discrimination.

Each institution that receives federal funding must designate at least one employee as Title IX coordinator whose duty is to oversee that Title IX is not being violated and to answer questions pertaining to Title IX. The Department of Health, Education and Welfare publishes regulations relating to Title IX and monitors compliance.

Because of court decisions, executive orders and various data collected over the past 40 years, Title IX may not be what you think it is. Here is your chance to learn more about Title IX and how it applies today.

Message from Your Co-President

AAUW CELEBRATES 140TH ANNIVERSARY

AAUW presented a video highlighting women throughout AAUW's long history. CEO Gloria Blackwell talked about the many challenges AAUW continues to face even though much progress has been made through research, advocacy, and education.

She announced the 2021 Alumnae Recognition Award – **Ngozi Okanjo-Iweala**, a Nigerian-American economist, who was named head of the World Trade Organization (WTO) in March of 2021. She is the first woman and the first African to lead the WTO. Gloria had interviewed her earlier and summarized many of her thoughts.



Years ago Dr. Okanjo-Iweala received an AAUW International Fellowship which supported her doctoral studies. She said receiving the fellowship was the happiest day of her life! The fellowship allowed her to continue her education. She had a 25-year career at the World Bank, rising to become managing Director for Operations from 2007 to 2011. She served two terms as Finance Minister of Nigeria, and also served as Minister for Foreign Affairs of Nigeria.

She has authored a book entitled "Women in Leadership." Dr. Okanjo-Iweala stated that women have the same qualities as men but have the lack of ego, have maturity, often overlooked, and are risk takers. When she was asked about the younger generation of women, she responded that she feels they are more likely to push ahead and are more open, and are still willing to help others.

In her book, she talks about how women need a voice, and men have a role. It is a life shift for men to share leadership with women. She talked about global community and the issues and struggles. We need to come together. She feels that women are more collaborative than men, reaching out to build trust. Her advice to young women: really climb the ladder, live the work and wake up in the morning caring about the world.

AAUW is proud of its 140 years empowering women. Who knows what the next 140 years will bring for women and girls!



Women's Reproductive Rights: Where Are We Now?

By January 20, 2022, the 49th anniversary of its *Roe v Wade* decision, the Supreme Court will have heard arguments on Texas legislation banning pregnancy termination after 6 weeks and on Mississippi legislation to ban abortion after 15 weeks. For Texas a decision will be made on the delegation of enforcement to citizens; in Mississippi the decision will be straightforward. One, the Supreme Court could overturn *Roe v Wade*. Two, the court could limit legal standing to challenges on state law, e.g., doctors wouldn't be able to challenge on behalf of patients. Three, new legal standards for the evaluation of abortion regulations may be created so states aren't required to show that the benefits of an abortion ban outweigh the undue burden to patients. One hundred six (106) state laws have been passed to restrict abortion in 2021. AAUW has submitted an amicus brief as to the constitutionality of the Mississippi law. The ACLU and others have brought lawsuits against other Mississippi abortion-related legislation like regulations for informed consent, a waiting period before the procedure, and ban on telemedicine visits.

The time to act is now. We must pressure the Senate to pass the Women's Health Protection Act of 2021 which has already passed the House, so that it becomes law in this session *Claire Noonan, AAUW California Public Policy Committee*
