In Memoriam



Message from Your Co-Presidents

Report on "Step-up for Pro Choice" event held January 22



Several branch members participated in the Zoom event presented by the Los Altos-Mountain View branch. There was a wealth of information presented by several speakers; this is only a summary. You can use the following link on our website to access the full event and other resources:

Leslie J. Reagan, professor at the University of Illinois at Urbana Champaign, reminded us of the history of women and abortion, including horror stories about "back alley" abortions and the particular problems which poor women faced. Following the 1973 Supreme Court decision in Roe v. Wade, mortality dropped 40% for women, and specialized abortion wards were no longer needed.

NARAL Counsel and Associate Director of Policy **Christina Krysinski** spoke about several court cases which have been brought since 1973. She also addressed steps that California can take to upgrade clinics in poor and rural areas and to provide support to the distressed women from other states.

State Senator **Josh Becker** has sponsored bills in California to address the impact of women coming from other states where they have limited abortion rights. He would like to see more training and more assistance with facilities.

Roe v. Wade affirmed a woman's constitutionally protected right to safe, legal abortion. But there is serious concern that the Supreme Court is going to roll back women's reproductive rights. Many states, notably Texas, and Mississippi. have enacted laws in their attempts to overturn this critical court decision and the 49 years of gains for women that have come with it. California is one of only 7 states that have women's reproductive rights written into their state constitution. If Roe v. Wade is overturned, California would be inundated with women coming from other states seeking help.

TAKE ACTION! It's time to step up and stop the roll back of reproductive rights! As Coretta Scott King said, "Freedom is never really won. You earn it and win it in every generation."

We hope you can join us virtually at our branch presentation by Shugri Said Salh on February 26 and at the Interbranch Council panel discussion "Title IX: What You Don't Know CAN Hurt You" on March 19. It's easy to register and both events are open to anyone -- invite your friends and family to learn more about what AAUW is doing.

Equal Pay Day Is March 15

AAUW believes that pay equity and equal employment opportunity are matters of simple fairness. We know that, on average, women earn about 80 cents for every dollar men earn. Each year **Equal Pay Day** symbolizes how far into the year women must work to earn what men earned in the previous year. For years it was a Tuesday in April, but happily, in 2021, the date was March 24, meaning that things had improved. And this year the news is even better: All women in the aggregate will reach parity with all white men on March 15, 2022. Better, but we're still not there.

Here are some suggestions for things you can do to highlight the wage gap:

- Encourage your representatives in Congress to support the Paycheck Fairness Act.
- Ask your city council or board of supervisors to issue a proclamation supporting pay equity.
- Wear Red to symbolize that women's paychecks are "in the red" when compared to men.
- Write a letter to the editor of your local paper or offer to submit an op-ed.
- Share a timely post on social media to spread awareness.
- Hold an event on your local campus and offer cookies to women that are proportionately smaller than the ones you offer to men. Also invite participants to become student affiliate members of AAUW.
