Meet Our Local Scholarship Recipients

The Local Scholarship Committee has awarded scholarships of \$3,000 each to two women students at West Valley College who are transferring to a four-year college in 2022-2023. Due to the on-going Covid-19 virus pandemic, it's been another strange year to give out scholarships, and we regret we are again unable to present these awards in person. We congratulate this year's recipients and wish them well.

Khatareh Taghizadeh has had a long path toward achieving her educational goals. She is from Iran, where it is considered inappropriate for women to study math and science, subjects which she loves. Due to her father's Baha'i faith, she was unable to attend college in Iran, so after working for some years and helping support her family, she immigrated to Turkey with her young daughter, in the hopes of eventually making it to the U.S. After six years in Turkey, Khatareh was able to obtain a U.S. visa and she came here to pursue her dream of becoming a computer engineer. Khatareh learned



English while studying in her field and supporting her daughter as a single mother. These past five years in California have been challenging, but this fall she plans to transfer to either San Jose State or San Francisco State University to complete her studies.

Hannah Wagster has long had a love of science and a strong desire to help others. She has lots of experience volunteering with children. Hannah has taken dance classes for many years and has taught dance as well. She has been tutoring peers in chemistry at West Valley College. She is in the Honors Program there, as well as the Alpha Gamma Sigma Honor Society. Hannah has had some setbacks along her educational path but has worked hard to overcome them and has found support in the Women in STEM group at West Valley College. She has even taken on a leadership role in that organization. This fall, Hannah plans to transfer to the University of California Santa Barbara, where she will major in Biopsychology. Her dream is to continue on to medical school and become a pediatrician.

AAUW Public Policy Committee

Are you interested in Public Policy? Consider joining the AAUW California Public Policy Committee which is now accepting applications. Here is a sample of what the committee did this year:

- Co-sponsored bills to help low-income working mothers lower their childcare costs, prevent women from other states from being sued in California for obtaining an abortion here, and secured a legislative resolution recognizing the 50th anniversary of Title IX.
- Supported 30 other bill that, among other things, require pay transparency reports on gender and ethnicity, and for women in the construction industry; prohibit businesses from charging more for women's products; require colleges to post uniform protocols for reporting campus sexual assault; provide relief for college students with dependent children; establish a state office of Racial Equity; and provide for confidentiality for election workers.

New year the Committee will be revising its Public Policy Priorities, working on an original AAUW bill, facing an important election in fall, 2022; and gearing up for a new legislative session and Lobby Day in spring, 2023. Check the California AAUW website for details.
