
Committee on Homeless Women and Children


Local Scholarship Committee

When Women Vote, We Change the Conversation!

AAUW encourages women voters to get involved in the political process and gain a better understanding of the impact legislative action can have on our lives. The recent US Supreme Court *Dobbs* decision on abortion has stimulated action in many states across the country. Our legislature passed and Governor Newsom signed AB1666 which will enable a woman coming into California to receive an abortion to be protected from lawsuits originating in her home state. This bill was cosponsored by AAUW – CA!

Congressional races are particularly important this November. Redistricting after the 2020 Census has changed the boundaries of many Congressional districts. Be informed about the candidates running in your district and their positions on issues that matter to us, our daughters, and granddaughters. Register to vote, if you haven't already. If you have recently moved, you need to update your information with the County Registrar of Voters.
