Message from Your Co-President WOMEN INVENTORS

March is Women's History Month. It's about time credit is given where credit is due. Here are some interesting inventions that women have created.

The Dishwasher: Josephine Cochrane invented the dishwasher in 1887. She also marketed her machine to hotel owners and opened her own factory without the help of a man.

Wireless transmission technology: Film star Hedy Lamarr invented a secret communications system during World War II for radio-controlled torpedoes. This technology helped pave the way for everything from Wi-Fi to GPS.

Closed Circuit TV: Marie Van Brittan Brown invented CCTV because of the slow response of police officers in 1969 to help people ensure their own security. Modern CCTV systems are used for home security and police work today.



Gas-powered central heating: Although Alice Parker's invention in 1919 of a gas-powered central heater was never manufactured, her idea inspired the central heating systems used today.



Kevlar: In 1965 Stephanie Kwolek, while searching for a lightweight and strong plastic for use in car tires, invented this life-saving material which is 5 times stronger than steel and is used, as one example, to make bulletproof vests.

Windshield Wiper: In 1903 Mary Anderson invented a windshield cleaning device, but it was not until after her patent expired that it became standard equipment on cars.

COBOL computer language: Dr. Grace Murray Hopper was a computer scientist who invented COBOL, the first user-friendly business computer software system, in the 1940's. She was also a rear admiral in the U.S. Navy and the first person to use the term "bug" in reference to a glitch in a computer system when she literally found a bug (moth) causing problems with her computer.

Aren't these women amazing!

Farewell to the Committee on Homeless Women and Children

It began in 1985 when Georgia Travis, a retired social worker, realized that there were homeless women and children in Silicon Valley -- and that AAUW should do something to help. Our committee started as a Women's Issue group that year; the next year it was adopted by the Interbranch Council (representing all AAUW branches in Santa Clara County). In order to raise money for the Committee on Homeless Women and Children, the Interbranch Special Projects Foundation (ISPF) was created in 1988 as a charitable nonprofit organization. The first ISPF project was the English Tea, an event that continued for many, many years.

Along with raising money for several local agencies helping homeless women and children, the Committee provided a hot lunch every month, hosted a holiday party with gifts for homeless women, and studied the enormous problems facing the homeless. Georgia's vision is now being sustained in the Georgia Travis House, part of LifeMoves, which provides stabilization, shelter, and services for homeless women and children in San Jose.

Elections

National and state elections are around the corner. You will receive voting information by email, and online voting is encouraged. Those without a valid email address will receive their ballot by regular mail.

The national election voting is open April 5 to May 15. Items on the ballot include approval of the Public Policy Priorities which establish the federal issues on which AAUW will focus their advocacy efforts, and Bylaws amendments related to Board operations and the structure of bylaws. Each year on March 31, the world observes Transgender Day of Visibility (TDOV) to raise awareness about transgender people. It is a day to celebrate the lives and contributions of trans people, while also drawing attention to the poverty, discrimination, and violence the community faces. Although the past decade has seen a more vocal public push for diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives around gender, the current sociopolitical climate of the United States is often openly hostile to transgender and gender non-confirming individuals.
