#### Prevent Book Banning and Curricula Censorship in California

In a 2023 survey, AAUW members made it clear that they were alarmed by the nationwide movement to ban books and censor curricula in K-12 schools, particularly as this censorship denies students' access to historically accurate information pertaining to marginalized groups. The California Public Policy Committee is hosting an important webinar on September 21 at 7 pm via Zoom for a presentation of "Book Banning and Curricula Censorship in California? AAUW California to the Rescue!"

Kathi Harper, School Board Project Committee Chair, will explain the project, what we are doing, and how all AAUW California members can help. Representatives from our collaborative partner, Equality California, and from the League of Women Voters will provide guidance on how to speak out effectively and civilly at school board meetings.
