Message from Our Co-Presidents

Three Women Win Nobel Prizes

Three of this year's winners of the Nobel Prize are women. Particularly notable is that these women all work in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) fields where women have historically been underrepresented.



Claudia Goldin produced ground-breaking research on women in the workforce and is the third woman to receive the Nobel Prize in Economics since the award started in 1969. She has spent decades analyzing 200 years of historical data to produce research showing the history of women in the job market. Her research includes pieces on the drivers of female labor-force participation, the origins of the gender pay gap, and hiring biases against women. She was the first woman to secure tenure in Harvard's economics department.

Katalin Kariko and her fellow researcher Drew Weissman were awarded the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine for their discoveries concerning nucleoside base modifications that enabled the development of effective mRNA vaccines against COVID-19. They found a way to modify mRNA and later developed a delivery technique to package the mRNA in lipid nanoparticles. This makes it possible for mRNA to reach the proper part of the body and trigger an immune response to fight disease.

Anne L'Huiller, along with Pierre Agostini and Ferenc Krausz, received the Nobel Prize in Physics for having demonstrated a way of creating extremely short pulses of light (measured in attoseconds) that can be used to measure the rapid processes in which electrons move or change energy. When electrons move in atoms and molecules, they move on attosecond timescales. By generating pulses of light that last tens or hundreds of attoseconds, scientists can study the movements of electrons.

How does this relate to AAUW? Those of you who heard our Tech Trek girls at our September meeting know that these young ladies are all excited about STEM after their week at the camp at Sonoma State. Maybe one of them will win a Nobel Prize some day!



Looking ahead, we have some great programs planned for the rest of our year, as you can tell from the first page of this Grapevine. We hope you will be able to join us. All the programs will be held at the Saratoga Library which is very accessible, and guests are always welcome.



AAUW California Priority Legislation Scorecard

We are happy to report that our priority bills did pretty well in this cycle. Twelve bills were sent to the governor's desk and 10 were signed into law. Another 16 bills were transitioned to 2-year bills meaning that they be reconsidered in the 2024 legislative cycle. Among the signed bills are these:

- **AB 1394** is the first-in-the-nation law holding social media companies accountable for child sex trafficking and abuse. Social media companies would face civil penalties for each act of commercial sexual exploitation facilitated, aided or abetted by their platform.
- **AB 524** prohibits discrimination against employees based on their status as a family caregiver.
- **AB 1071** authorizes and encourages school districts to provide teen dating violence prevention education to all pupils in grades 7-12.
- **AB 1078** expands the diversity of the social science curriculum, requiring instruction in social sciences to include a study of the role and contributions of people of all genders, Latino Americans, LGBTQ+ Americans and other ethnic, cultural, religious, and socioeconomic status groups.
