Message from Our Co-Presidents Important National Bylaws Vote

This spring AAUW members will be asked to vote on amendments to the national bylaws recommended by the AAUW Board of Directors and AAUW Governance Committee to open membership. This means that membership would be open to any person who is passionate about equity for women, whether they have a degree or not. Members have voted on this issue before, and you undoubtedly have many questions which you will want to look into before you vote.

March Is Women's History Month

The first Women's History DAY was held on February 28, 1909, to commemorate the one-year anniversary of the garment workers' strikes to protest their working conditions. That Day became Women's History WEEK on March 8, 1978, to draw attention to the fact that women's history wasn't really included in K-12 school curriculums at the time. In 1980 Women's History MONTH began when President Jimmy Carter declared March as Women's History Month. Since 1995, every president has proclaimed March as Women's History Month.

Wyoming Territory was the first place to grant women the right to vote in 1869, and they elected the country's first female governor, **Nellie Tayloe Ross** in 1924.

Marie Curie was the first woman to receive two Nobel prizes, first for physics in 1903 and then for chemistry in 1911.

Edith Wharton became the first woman to win a Pulitzer Prize in 1921 for her novel *The Age of Innocence*.

Eleanor Roosevelt held the first all-women press conference in 1933, and over the next 12 years held 348 press conferences for women reporters.

Katherine Graham was the first woman to become a Fortune 500 CEO in 1972 when she took over leadership of the Washington Post.

School Book Banning A Primer for Readers of All Ages

- How should we provide and protect freedom of speech in public schools?
- How has school book banning changed, or remained the same, across the decades?
- Who is driving the current book banning movement, and who is impacted by book restriction?
- How can we advocate for reading in the Education Democracy?

Dr. Jennifer Lynn Wolf is a Senior Lecturer in the Stanford Graduate School of Education, where she teaches courses in Teaching and Learning, English Teacher Education, and Young Adult Literature. She directs undergraduate programs in the Graduate School of Education, a program designed to prepare college students to participate as informed citizens of the Education Democracy.

Mindfulness As a Key to Stress Management Free Online Class: Thursdays, March 7–May 2, 9:30~12 noon on Zoom

Stress is everywhere in our modern lives. We are overwhelmed by work, family, relationships and social unrest. Stress leads us to feel anxious and depressed. It contributes to sleeplessness and loss of appetite or overeating. While we cannot control what happens around us, we can control how we respond to stress. Mindfulness teaches us techniques for stress management. Mindfulness is the practice of focusing on moment-to-moment experience without self-criticism and with acceptance. Mindfulness helps us mobilize our inner resources to meet the challenges of everyday life.



Kelly Weisberg is a lawyer/sociologist and certified mindfulness instructor who taught law and human behavior classes for 40 years. The stress from teaching, writing, and family responsibilities led her to take stress management classes and later to teach them. This class will focus on Mindfulness-Based Stress Reduction, started by Jon Kabat-Zinn, which rests on scientific evidence that supports its beneficial effects on health and well-being.

The class meets online for 8 weeks for 2.5 hours (on Thursday mornings) from 9:30 am -12 noon, March 7 to May 2. Participants are guided

through formal mindfulness practices, small group discussion and talks, and practices/exercises. Continuing education credits (27) are available for nurses and mental health professionals. There are only a few seats left!
